Blackrod Town Council support World Scout Jamboree Participant



Blackrod Town Council has made a small donation towards the fund of Maiti Hutchinson, a young person from Blackrod, who has been selected to attend the 23rd World Scout Jamboree in Japan next year.

The World Scout Jamboree takes place in a different country every four years

and gives Scouts aged 14 – 18 years the opportunity to meet many other Scouts from all over the world, to work with them on projects, to learn new skills, to find out about each other's lives and cultures. Before the Jamboree, Maiti will get to meet up with the other 4000 participants from the UK and they will spend 3 or 4 days exploring Tokyo before taking the bullet train to the Jamboree site. After the Jamboree, Maiti and her unit

will get a taste of what real Japanese culture is like when she lives with a Japanese family for 3 or 4 days before returning back to the UK.

Maiti has told of how, from selection in 2013 through to the Jamboree in 2015, she will be taking part in various training events to prepare for the time in Japan: learning to live with other members of the group: cook for each other; undertake daily tasks such as hand washing their clothes and develop sufficient outdoors skills to build a successful camp site to

sustain them for the entire period.

Maiti said she is "delighted to have the support of the Town Council in going to the World Scout Jamboree. The generosity and enthusiasm of the town has been brilliant at various fundraising events I have run in Blackrod and neighbouring towns.

I am proud to represent Blackrod at the Jamboree and hope to enthuse other scouts at 47th Bolton -

where I am a young leader- and at other Scout groups when i return."

Beavers, Cubs and Scouts.....

Scouting has rarely been more popular today, thanks in part to the prominent leadership of Bear Grylls, the Chief Scout but also the high profile and active support of some of the country's most influential people, such as the Duchess of Cambridge.

The numbers of young people joining Scouting continues to rise, partly due to opening up to girls a few years ago. Nationally there are now about 550,000 young people in Scouts and here in Blackrod, we continue to contribute to this healthy situation. Scouting has taken place in the village for many years, with the present 47th Bolton (Blackrod) Group celebrating its 50th year in 2015.

Although presently lacking a Scout Troop, there are thriving Beaver and Cubs Sections; Beavers are for 6 –8 year olds and Cubs are 8 up to 11 years of age.

After Cubs, young people can join a Scout Troop in Horwich

if they want to continue their Scouting experience. Scouting is an international voluntary organisation, believing that the world is a better place when people are trustworthy, self-controlled and self-confident. We work together in a context of enjoying what we do and having fun to serve other people and to improve society, showing responsibility towards the natural world and fostering self-respect and respect for others.

Beavers and Cubs meet Monday evenings at Blackrod Church School, Vicarage Road West: Beavers 6.00-7.00pm, Cubs 6.30-7.30pm. As a positive way of helping your community, adults volunteering as helpers are particularly needed and are always very welcome.
